Z-Axis, a US-based company which uses visual technology such as animations, still graphics and interactive CDs to communicate complex legal and technical issues in an easy-to-use way, has launched in the UK.

The company has been involved in high profile cases including the World Trade Center insurance litigation, the prosecution of the Oklahoma City bomber, and a number of legal battles over air disasters.

Producer Cindy Buxton, who previously worked for Z-Axis in Denver, has recently returned to her native Britain to launch the business here. She says: '87% of the cases we work on are either won or settled in our clients' favour.'

In the UK the company plans to focus on visual aids for pre-trial hearings, mediations and arbitrations.
