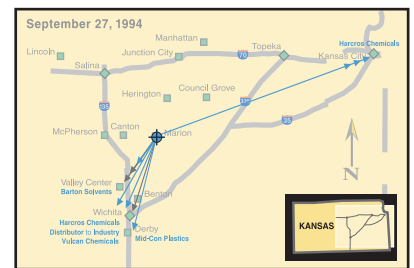


**SYNOPSIS**

On April 19, 1995 a bomb destroyed the Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City killing 168 people. Timothy J. McVeigh and Terry Nichols were arrested for planning and executing this act and tried separately.

Because of the scope and nature of the exhibits that might be displayed, the Department of Justice hired Z-Axis to assist in determining how to visually present the most pertinent evidence in a clear and concise manner. Z-Axis provided consulting on visual problem solving, and a method for organizing and presenting exhibits. In both trials prosecutors used exhibit boards, edited news footage, video, animation and the VuPoint presentation system to present their case.

The judge insisted the courtroom technology had to be efficient, fast, reliable and invisible. VuPoint gave the prosecutors control over their exhibits before and during trial. The media made reference to seamless choreography of witness and evidence. The subtle yet powerful technology assisted the prosecution who was praised for their effectiveness in communicating their case with clarity and impact.
